



AUTISM DIAGNOSTIC INTERVIEW - REVISED (ADI-R) Introductory Clinical Workshop Application

Thank you for your interest in the Autism Diagnostic Interview - Revised (ADI-R): Introductory Clinical Workshop at the North Central Ohio Educational Service Center.

This training is designed for clinicians with a prior background in autism, clinical interviewing and assessment of individuals with ASD. Psychologists, physicians, speech-language pathologists, social workers as well as professionals and graduate students in related fields are welcome to apply. Those who intend to use the ADI-R in research, must attend the ADI-R Research Training and establish research with a designated research group.

During this two-day workshop, trainers will provide an overview of ASD, including the importance of early diagnosis and treatment and best practices for diagnosing ASD. Additionally, trainers will present on the clinical use of the ADI-R including a review of administration and scoring procedures. The ADI-R (authored by Michael Rutter, Anne Le Couteur, and Catherine Lord) is a comprehensive interview that provides a thorough assessment of individuals suspected of having an autism spectrum disorder. The interview questions, which are administered to caregivers, cover several content areas including early development, language acquisition/possible loss of language or other skills, current functioning in regard to language and communication, social development and play, as well as restricted interests and repetitive behaviors. The ADI-R in conjunction with the Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule-2 Edition (ADOS-2) has proven very effective in diagnosing autism spectrum disorders in individuals suspected of having autism.

Independent trainers will be providing the workshop through a variety of teaching methods, including lectures, videos, coding discussions and administration of the instrument.
